We turn to you in the way of our ancient ancestors, grateful for the abundance of food and festivity that surrounds us at this time of year.

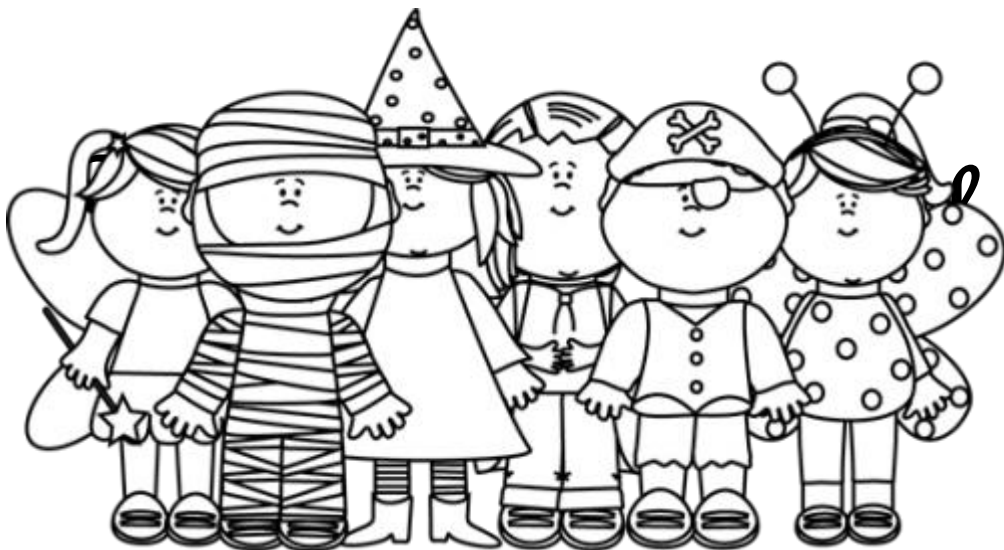
Keep all children safe as they embark on their Halloween revels.

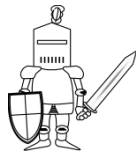

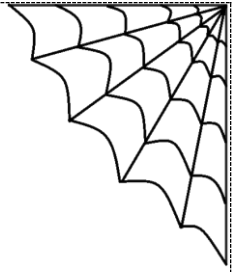

The excitement of Halloween is now building, as we begin to plan our costumes and look forward to Trick-or-Treating!



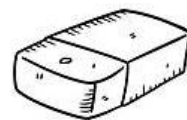
Junior Entrepreneur Programme

1916 Rising My Family History

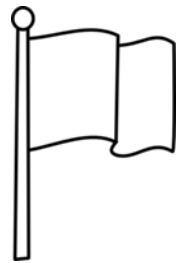

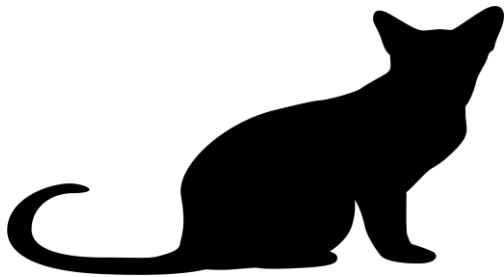
Halloween History

What is Halloween all about?

- ❖ Celts were people who lived in Ireland hundred of years ago.
- ❖ The Celts celebrated their New Year's Eve on October 31st.
- ❖ They called this festival Samhain - this is the Irish word for November.

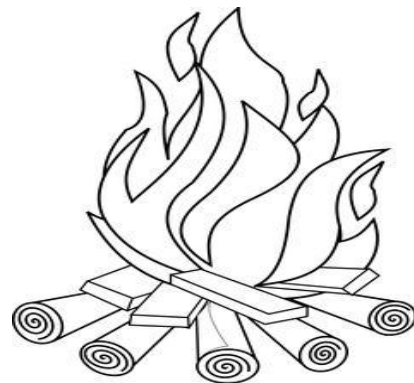


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- ❖ We remember those who have died during the month of November.



- ❖ This Festival marked the end of the "season of the Sun" (Summer) and the beginning of "the season of darkness and cold" (winter).
- ❖ The Celts believed that evil spirits came with the long hours of winter darkness and they could be seen on earth.
- ❖ The Celts built bonfires to frighten the spirits away and feasted and danced around the fires.



FIRE

The earliest recorded history of fireworks was in 7th century China where they were invented. The Chinese used fireworks to celebrate festivities and then their popularity spread throughout the world. We use them in Ireland at Halloween and other celebrations. We also have bonfires at Halloween. The word bonfire is derived from fires that burned bones. On Halloween night we light bonfires to celebrate, but we don't burn bones, we burn wood and other things outdoors.
